WILD: A Musical Becoming with Idina Menzel

BCC partnered with the American Repertory Theater (ART) at Harvard University for the creation and premiere of a brand new musical, "WILD: A Musical Becoming." Singers joined a star-studded creative team, including Justin Tranter (songwriter to Dua Lipa, Ariana Grande and Lady Gaga), V (former Eve Ensler, author of The Vagina Monologues), and Artistic Director, Diane Paulus.

Arnold Arboretum Filming


More than 90 Boston Children's Chorus singers gathered at the Arnold Arboretum of Harvard University to create a video focused on environmental justice. We partnered with our friends at the Arboretum to share a critical message about preserving the environment for generations to come. Known as the museum of trees, the Leventritt Shrub & Vine Garden was an ideal backdrop to film two environmental themed music videos featuring our Lower Choir singers.



A Diverse Approach to the Choral Canon in the 21st Century

BCC is well regarded for its pedagogical model centered on cultural equity, celebrating diverse musical cultures, and facilitating creative artistry through student voices. The "Opus Nuovo" initiative is our innovative response to broaden the choral repertoire for both student and professional choirs. Now in its second phase, this project is designed to identify, commission, and collaborate with ten highly sought-after global composers and artists to facilitate the creation and performance of a collection of new choral works. Aligned with BCC's vision of cultural equity, these new pieces represent a true spectrum of global musical styles and approaches. BCC singers actively participate in the creative composition process, hone listening and understanding skills, and gain rich performance opportunities.

This past season, BCC engaged two composers to work with our singers to focus on new works focusing on environmental justice, aligning with our season theme. Syrian educator and composer Suad Bushnaq worked with our Lower Choir singers to create a three-movement "Climate Cantata," telling stories of climate change through fairytale characters and stories. Mexican composer Jorge Sosa engaged with our Upper Choir singers to develop a new youth operetta - "The Rising Tide" - reflecting on the climate emergency through the eyes of youth.





Recruitment and Access Campaign

Designed to build bridges and access to BCC's programs for more diverse and underserved young people, the Recruitment and Access Campaign addresses the pandemic-related attrition experienced by BCC and many other youth choirs.

BCC is committed to bringing the joy of choral music to even more young people! We plan on dramatically expanding our local neighborhood services over the coming years. By creating neighborhood-based access points, BCC can more readily:

- Recruit new singers into BCC's musical training and social justice programming, build our visibility, and increase trust.
- Share our curriculum and the joy of choral singing to a broader audience.
- Prioritize the needs of underserved and underrepresented families, fostering deep reciprocal partnerships with the schools and other institutions that anchor their communities.
- Connect Boston neighborhoods and nearby Gateway Cities, and provide vital support for transportation and financial aid.

Through our partnership with the Surround Care Coalition, under the leadership of Mossik Hacobian and the Higher Ground team, BCC has been fortunate to visit classrooms in Dorchester once weekly for seven weeks each semester to provide music and movement classes for young children ages 4-6. Next season, the initiative will increase targeted outreach to ten neighborhood schools between South Boston, Mattapan, Dorchester, East Boston, Chinatown, and Allston/Brighton.

Summer with "We Sing"

In partnership with the Friends of the Public Garden, BCC hosted free outdoor community open singing events each Saturday and Sunday in the summer of 2021. Available to community members of all age and skill levels, these joyful programs provided free summer enrichment and social opportunities for children in BIPOC neighborhoods and low-income communities immediately following a yearlong period of isolation and distance from peers. Each weekend day, BCC singers joined their families, alumni, and community members for a 75-minute celebratory event of singing, games, socializing, and community building.





Vaccine Clinics



BCC teamed up with partners at Boston Medical Center to host pop-up vaccine centers to contribute to the health equity movement sparked by the COVID-19 crisis. The events were held at our main office on Old Colony Avenue in Boston and were open to all singers, their families, and the general public over the age of 5.

RETURNING TO THE STAGE



Our singers were thrilled to return to Boston Symphony Hall for the "19th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Tribute Concert: Can You See The Stars?". The performance highlighted Dr. King's labor and civil rights work, which paved the way for the activism embodied in the modernday environmental movement.

Over 250 BCC voices were joined by

- Guest Conductor Alysia Lee, a Kennedy Center Citizen Artist and Founder and Artistic Director of Sister Cities Girlchoir, the El Sistema-inspired, girl empowerment choral academy in Philadelphia, Camden, and Baltimore:
- Guest Artists Renese King, a nationally recognized instrumentalist, choral director of the New England Gospel Ensemble, and arranger; and,
- Reverend William Bodrick, Senior Pastor of the Historic Twelfth Baptist Church in Roxbury, MA.



Youth have boldly been at the forefront of climate climate youth leaders, Boston Children's Chorus sang about their power to affect change. Joined by featured artists the Eureka Ensemble and Opus Nuovo composers Jorge Sosa and Kathy Wonson Eddy. 




